New Book by Dr. E. L. Stevenson

Former pupils of Professor Edward Luther Stevenson will be interested to know that the Rutgers University Press has recently issued an advance notice of a book, *Sebastian Cabot and His Spanish Services*, by Dr. Stevenson, which it proposes to publish in 1941. The handsome prospectus reproduces in collotype a map of the world, dated 1544 and attributed to Cabot, from the unique original in the Bibliothèque Nationale.
