CARYN RADICK is digital archivist at Special Collections and University Archives and associate editor of *The Journal of the Rutgers University Libraries*. She is the author of "'Complete and in Order': Bram Stoker's *Dracula* and the Archival Profession," published in the *American Archivist* (2013) and works on projects to digitize Special Collections and University Archives' materials.

THOMAS J. FRUSCIANO has been the university archivist at Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey, since 1989. He is the author of several books and articles on the history of Rutgers, including "Rutgers History and Politics" co-authored with Benjamin Justice that appeared in *Rutgers, A 250th Anniversary Portrait* (2015); *The Rutgers University Football Vault: History of the Scarlet Knights* (2008); "Queen's College—Child of the Awakening," *Rutgers Journal of Law and Religion* (2016); "To Cultivate Piety, Learning, and Liberty: The College of New Jersey and Queen's College, 1746–1794," *Journal of the Rutgers University Libraries* (1993); and "Leadership on the Banks: Rutgers' Presidents, 1766–1991," *Journal of the Rutgers University Libraries* (1991). He is member of the Planning Committee for the Rutgers 250th anniversary and has participated in many of the events that have taken place during the celebration. He is currently engaged in research on the connection of slavery to the founding and early history of Rutgers.

DAVID J. FOWLER (GSNB '79, '87) is a consultant and researcher. He has worked as a project historian with Special Collections and University Archives at Rutgers University Libraries. In 2009 and 2010 he co-curated two exhibitions on Henry Rutgers, in conjunction with which he authored the biographical essay "Benevolent Patriot: Henry Rutgers, 1745–1830." He also edited *Railroads and New Jersey: A Bibliography of Contemporary Publications, 1812–1901* (Rutgers University Libraries, 2011), and curated a related exhibition. An early American specialist, Dr. Fowler's research focuses on civil conflict on the home front in New Jersey during the Revolutionary War.

ROBERT G. SEWELL is the editor of the *Journal of the Rutgers University Libraries* and was, for over 20 years, Rutgers' associate university librarian of collection development and management, to whom Special Collections and University Archives reported. He is currently professor emeritus at Rutgers.
